

5 star rating for local Nursing Home

All Hallows Nursing Home in Bungay underwent a routine inspection by environmental health from Waveney District Council on 3rd September 2010. Judith Fay, Kitchen Assistant and Dianne Ollett, Deputy Cook were also interviewed. Following the inspection the housekeeping team led by Mrs. Bev Dinsdale received fantastic news from Waveney District Council informing them that they had decided to upgrade the star rating at the home from a 3 to a 5 star under the Scores on the Doors scheme. This is the first inspection the housekeeping department at the Home has had under Bev's management and the whole team are delighted with the news.

The star rating 5 stars out of 5 shows that the home has very high hygiene standards and is fully compliant with food legislation. The upgrade is based on evidence of substantial and sustainable improvements since the last routine inspection. The Scores on the Doors scheme set by Waveney District Council is a simple system of scoring food businesses within their area for hygiene and legal compliance. For many years businesses cooking and preparing food have been rated for various safety issues using a complex national scoring scheme. Scores on the doors takes three key elements of this rating process and combines them into a star rating for an at a glance assessment of food safety. The three rating scores that are combined are for food safety practices, the condition of the structure and equipment and the confidence in how food safety at the business is managed.
